



# **COVID-19 & Bleeding Disorders**

- Are PWH at increased risk of having COVID-19?
  - No. Risk factors for severity of disease
- Can COVID-19 be transmitted through plasma products?
  - Thought to be highly unlikely, being closely monitored
- Does COVID-19 treatment protocol require special care for people with bleeding disorders?
  - Yes. Management of coagulation deficiency is complex during severe COVID-19...








- Emergency and urgency dental care is provided with advice on the strict personal protection and measures to reduce or avoid production of droplets and aerosols





# PREVENTION: WHY IT WAS IMPORTANT PRE- COVID-19, NOW AND FOR THE FUTURE

- Pre-covid-19
- Prevention in dentistry:
  - Focuses in maintaining good oral health
  - Preventing dental problems
  - Preventing oral bleeding
  - Preventing infection
  - Preventing pain
- Prevention is based on:
  - Definition of Guidelines and Manuals
  - Reinforce education patients, dentist and interdisciplinary team
  - Behavior determination
    - Oral hygiene
    - Use of fluoride
    - Limiting sugar intake
    - Avoiding habits which may cause bleeding in the mouth



# Now

- Only emergency and urgency
- Now and for the future of the Covid-19 era
  - Improved communication and access to information
    - Establishment of Guidelines and Manuals from the Health Institutions responsible for the patient's care
      - WFH
    - Establishment and improvement of communication channels between patients and health care professionals (fast and dynamic communication)
      - Teledentistry
      - WhatsApp



- Now and for the Future in the Covid-19 era
  - Change Behavior
    - Improve self-care
      - Washing hands
      - General measures of hygiene (following Health Ministry recommendation)
      - Taking care of hygiene tools (not sharing tooth brushing)
      - Washing hands before and after brushing
      - Social etiquette when sneeze and cough
      - Wearing masks (following Health Ministry recommendation)
      - Physical distancing (WHO recommendation)



- Now and in the Future in the Covid-19 era
  Improve oral hygiene
  - Brushing twice a day with fluoride toothpaste
  - Flossing at least, once a day

# Change habits

- Limiting sugar intake to mealtimes
- Avoiding habits that might cause injury in the mouth or tooth fractures
- Avoid using your teeth for opening bottles
- Avoid chewing hard sticky food



- Now and for the Future on covid-19 era
  - Prevention is key: preventing oral diseases is important and achievable
  - In the time of pandemic covid-19, the patient should preserve and promote his own health and well-being so far as is reasonably open to him to do so.


