

1. BEGINNING OF TWINNING MAPUTO CENTRAL HOSPITAL (MCH)/ UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA SAN DIEGO (UCSD)

- 1st contact in 2017 with several visits and missions of Dr Annette von Drygalski to Maputo
- Officialization of twinning end 2018
- To date: 9 visits

GOALS and ACTIVITIES

- Donations including equipment and factor
- Discussion and interaction with patients, during clinic
- Meetings with NMO
- Musculoskeletal Ultrasound (MSKUS) to assess recent joint bleeding or synovitis/ arthrosis
- Training and lectures
- Creation of Multidisciplinary team
- Creation of Hemophilia Treatment Center (HTC)
- Meetings with Hospital Directors and with Minister of Health



2. SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES 2019

DONE:

- Training exchange visits between HCPs from MCH and UCSD to augment local expertise
- Training of blood bank staff in production and handling of cryoprecipitate and other factor concentrates and possible training in provincial blood banks

POSTPONED:

Visits to other provinces for laboratory and diagnostic capacity building

ONGOING:

- Creation of a center and multidisciplinary team for adult and pediatric hemophilia care
- Development of educational materials for health professionals (i.e. presentations, brochures, books)
- Establish a national patient registry and data collection tools

PHYSIOTHERAPY TRAINING; MULTIDISCIPLINARY TEAM(2019 AUGUST)



















DONE

- 1. Establish protocol for **chemical synoviorthesis** with Rifampicin (using **ultrasound-guided injection**)
- 2. Continued capacity building of local blood bank to advance the procurement of safe blood products. Installation of freezer and equipment
- **3**. Development and printing of educational materials

ONGOING

- **1. Capacity building** on diagnosis and management in one region in Mozambique (Beira) and provinces in central region
- **2.** Establish patient registry, register and obtain ethics approval for World Bleeding Disorders Registry (WBDR)
- **3.** Develop a pathway for laboratory diagnosis in major hospitals in Mozambique, especially central and northern Mozambique
- **4.** Creation **Hemophilia Treatment Center (HTC)** with multidisciplinary team (adult and pediatric). Draft memorandum of understanding to guarantee 2 rooms for management and treatment of patients



4. CHALLENGES AND CURRENT ACTIVITIES (CONSTRAINTS OF PANDEMIC COVID19)





What we have done:

- 1. Early March visit of Dr. von Drygalski:
- Intraarticular injection with anti-inflammatory agent (triamcinolone and lidocaine), rifampicin not available
- Lectures and meetings with multidisciplinary team and NMO;
- MSKSU in hemophilic patients
- 2. Acquisition and installation of a freezer for cryoprecipitate production and storage
- 3. Creation of **educational materials** and printing for to distribute to other central hospitals and general hospitals in the provinces (emergency department, doctors and nurses who deal with hemophilia)
- 4. Acquisition of a router and zoom account for meetings and training online with health professionals from hospitals in other provinces, and including professionals from UCSD (Dr. von Drygalski and others); also to discuss laboratory diagnosis

- We have successfully completed 2 years of the twinning program. This
 year being the 3rd.
- Has been one of the most effective programs in creating and showcasing leadership across the country.
- Has identified and created a dedicated team of Master trainers, who have helped in content creation for the youth training programs.

BEFORE THE TRAVEL BAN

- I was a part of the Steps for Living facilitation training conducted by the National Hemophilia Foundation at their office in New York from 5th to 7th January.
- We conducted the Annual Youth Meet (AYM) from February 7th to 8th at Kolkata, India.
- The new Youth Committee was elected during the same meeting.
- We conducted a one day training program for the new YC on the 9th of February that focused on self sustainability and development.
- Kenneth Mcelderry from the National Hemophilia Foundation was with us for both the AYM and the YC training program.



BEFORE THE TRAVEL BAN















LOCKDOWN AND COVID-19

- Uncertainty and mixed information about Covid-19.
- A lot of hemophilia treatment centers were converted into Covid centers so it wasn't easy to access AHF.
- Travel bans meant PWH needed a travel pass to reach the hospital which was difficult to get.
- Couriers and shipping were also paused, which lead to more problems as emergency factor supplies at the chapters started depleting and the management of HFI couldn't send more factors to them.





- So with everything that was happening, we had to figure out how we can help with the situation and help the PWH in coping with everything.
- We let the management at HFI take care of the core medical aspect of Covid-19.
- The main topics that we decided to focus on were:
 - General awareness and Safety measures,
 - Reduction of factor dependance,
 - Mental and physical health
- Thanks to the communication streams that we have built from the beginning of the twinning program, we could reach out to more youth and get them involved in the sessions.

- We conducted one session on Awareness about Covid and safety measures in each region, North, South, East and West.
- We conducted one session on Physiotherapy and bleed management in each region.
- We conducted a psychosocial webinar with Dr. Richa Mohan and Ed Kuebler as speakers.







































LOOKING FORWARD

- We have been in constant touch with NHF regarding the events conducted.
- In our recent call we drew out a plan for the upcoming online regional training programs and master training program as we have decided to suspend all physical meetings.
- We have conducted surveys with all the regions to assess the key points or concepts the youth want to learn as well so we can include sessions that cater to their needs.
- We expect to start the regional training programs in the end of October or the beginning of November 2020.
