12 guiding principles of care that aim for ideal hemophilia management to ensure that people with hemophilia have access to appropriate, sustained, and high-quality medical services and comprehensive care

(it should be recognized that the priorities and capabilities in each country determine what is practical at any point in time)

Principle 1	National coordination and delivery of hemophilia care
Principle 2	Access to safe CFCs, hemostasis products, and curative therapies
Principle 3	Laboratory services and genetic diagnosis of hemophilia
Principle 4	Education and training in hemophilia care
Principle 5	Clinical and epidemiological research
Principle 6	Acute and emergency care for bleeds
Principle 7	Multidisciplinary care for hemophilia
Principle 8	Regular replacement therapy (prophylaxis)
Principle 9	Management of patients with inhibitors
Principle 10	Management of musculoskeletal complications
Principle 11	Management of specific conditions and comorbidities
